Killed in the crash approximately six miles south of Elgin was Vijjeswarpu S. Christopher of Booker, Roy Henry Grunden of Childress, Donald D. Homes of Perryton and Jeffy Weatherby of Perryton. Christopher, the pilot of the aircraft, was an MD.; Homes, 36, was a pathologist; Weatherby, 44, was a member of

the Ochiltree Hospital Board of Directors; and Grunden, 34, was an R.N. and the director of nursing at Ochiltree Hospital in Perryton. The medical professionals were flying from Perryton to Austin for a Texas Medical Foundation conference.

Childress, Texas--Roy Henry Grunden, 34, died in a plane crash near Elgin, Texas on June 10. Services will be at 2 p.m. Monday at First Baptist Church in Childress with the Rev. Mike McKinney and the Rev. Tommy Sims officiating. Burial will be in Childress Cemetery. Grunden was born Nov. 28, 1953 in Cheyenne, Wyo. He was an Air Force veteran and director of nurses at Ochiltree General Hospital. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Perryton, Texas, and was a Mason and Scoutmaster in Childress.
